### FIRST LTTA MOBILITY

#### The agenda of the meeting;

#### 17 October Sunday:

Partners arrived in Poland and settled in the hotel and some students at host families.

#### 18 October Monday:

Partners met at the host school for the opening ceremony in the morning. After a short tour at school host school presented the official "YouTube Channel" of the project and partners watched the videos prepared by students about their schools. There were also some ice-breaker activities for students.

After the lunch at school partners left for Pszczyna and visited the palace, the main square, the park and the bison reserve.

<u>19 October Tuesday:</u> After breakfast we left for a daily trip to Katowice and first had a tour at an old miners' quarter called Nikiszowiec and visited the Silesian Museum. After a walk around the city centre including former industrial areas turned into cultural attractions we had some free time and then got on the bus to go back to Gilowice.

#### 20 October Wednesday:

In the morning we left Gilowice for a trip to a coal mine turned into a museum—Guido in Zabrze. After enjoying some traditional Silesian dishes in lunch students had free and teachers had a project meeting at school to discuss and plan the next steps of the project. In the evening there was an official dinner for teachers organised by the host school.

<u>21 October Thursday:</u> In the morning we left the hotel for a trip to Cracow where we had a guided tour around the Old Town and visited rhe oldest and most important university educating miners (AGH-University of Science and Technology). We attended a lecture about mining industry in Poland at the university. After some free time in Cracow we set off for Gilowice.

#### 22 October Friday:

In the morning we met at school and students presented their presentations about traditions of mining communities in their countries. We had an online contact with the Turkish students and they presented their presentations online.

After the coffee break there was an evaluation session for students in international groups on Wakelet platform.

We had lunch at school and in the afternoon there was the certification ceremony and the official closing of the meeting.
